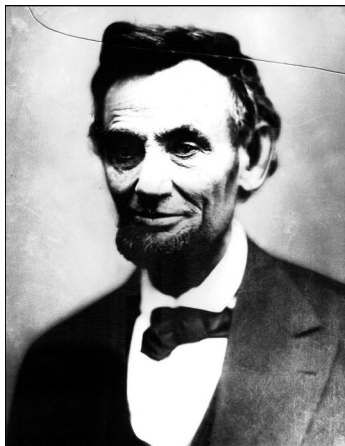


## Civil War Symposium

**Join us for a full day of  
Civil War scholarship**

The handsome historic landmark Andrew Carnegie Free Library & Music Hall is one of only four libraries in this country that Andrew Carnegie endowed. It opened in 1901 as the enduring thank you gift from the philanthropist to the community that incorporated in 1894 to take his name.

In addition to housing a fine community library and acoustically superb music hall, the “Carnegie Carnegie” is home to a true national treasure — the Capt. Thomas Espy Post No. 153 of the Grand Army of the Republic. The Post has been documented as perhaps the most intact GAR Post in the country. At one time there were close to 7,000 posts from Portland, Maine to Portland, Oregon. The Espy Post was meticulously restored in 2010 to its turn of the last century condition.

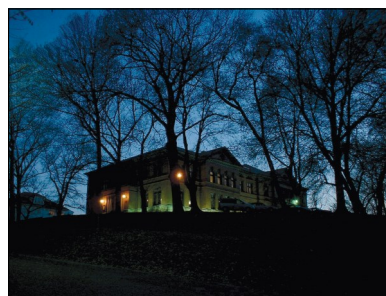

## SPEAKERS

### Julie Mujic, Ph.D.

#### Capital University

Dr. Julie Mujic earned her Ph.D. at Kent State University. She specializes in the northern home front during the American Civil War and teaches a range of classes regarding 19<sup>th</sup> century United States history. Dr. Mujic has written a number of articles and essays in her field and is publishing her first manuscript with Fordham University Press – *Why They Stayed: the Mind of Northern Men in the Civil War Midwest*.

### Daniel Welch

Dan Welch currently serves as an educator with a public school district in northeast Ohio. Previously, he served as Education Programs Coordinator for the Gettysburg Foundation and continues to serve as a seasonal Gettysburg National Military Park ranger. His first book, *The Last Road North: A Guide to the Gettysburg Campaign, 1863* was released in June 2016. He earned his MA in Military History with a Civil War Era concentration at American Military University.

### Kristopher D. White

#### Co-founder, Chief Historian, Emerging Civil War

Kris White is a graduate of Norwich University with a M.A. in Military History. He served as staff military historian at Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park and was a member of the Association of Licensed Battlefield Guides at Gettysburg. He has co-authored numerous books on the American Civil War. Kris, along with longtime friend Chris Mackowski, were honored in 2016 by the Army Historical Foundation with its Lt. Gen. Richard G. Trefry Award for contributions to the field.

### Eric J. Wittenberg

When not practicing law for a living, Mr. Wittenberg is an award winning Civil War historian, blogger, speaker, battlefield preservationist and tour guide. He is the author of nearly twenty books and numerous articles that have appeared in various national magazines. His focus is on the Civil War cavalryman and the cavalry battles of the Civil War, with emphasis on the Army of the Potomac's Cavalry Corps. He is an acknowledged authority on Federal Cavalry in the Eastern Theater. His first book, *Gettysburg's Forgotten Cavalry Actions*, was chosen winner of Robert E. Lee Bachelder-Coddington Award.
