Rea Andrew Redd, “Gettysburg and Lincoln: The Aftermath and the Address

The Battle of Gettysburg was a turning point in the Civil War. The Union victory ended General Robert E. Lee’s second and most ambitious invasion of the North. In recognition of Lincoln’s most famous speech, Rea Andrew Redd will discuss this most important battle as part of the ongoing Second Saturday Lectures at the ACFL&MH. His presentation will include the Battle of Gettysburg’s emergency medical situation, the farms used as hospitals, the creation of the national cemetery at Gettysburg and more.
